Festive Times with Fallbrook Garden Club

Fallbrook is an unincorporated area in the northeast corner of San Diego County. The Fallbrook Garden Club (FGC) was established in 1931, making FGC a charter member of what is today California Garden Clubs, Inc. Mabel Richardson was the first President of FGC. During October and December, FGC is all about community.

October festivities start with **Scarecrow Days** and the Harvest Faire, which the Club has participated in for 12 years.

Local businesses and organizations create many scarecrows. They are displayed throughout the town from October 1 until the end of the month, on the sidewalks, shop windows, or even on top of buildings. Beginning in August, FGC's members started working on "Mabel," the scarecrow. This year, members created "Mabel the Gardener". Her jacket was covered in succulents.

In the middle of October is the **Fallbrook Harvest** Faire, where FGC members volunteered at the Club's booth promoting the benefits of being a member, as well as the CGCI and NGC projects, while handing out handmade packets of California wildflower seeds to the visitors. The Club shared the booth with Fallbrook Fire Safety Council as a community service. The visitors were educated on how to prevent fire risks. They were told about a chipping event where all their trimmings/cuttings would be chipped free of charge, thus helping clear their properties from fire danger.

At the **FGC Pumpkin Succulent Workshop**, San Diego County Sheriff's Volunteer Patrol, and Club members worked together at a member's home, decorating 25 pumpkins with donated succulent cuttings from member's gardens. Then, the sheriff's volunteers delivered the pumpkins to the community's homebound a week before Halloween.

The assorted decorated pumpkins were made for the San Diego County Sheriff's YANA (You Are Not Alone) Program. FGC has been decorating the pumpkins for the YANA program for over 10 years
