

**How does your garden grow?
(Excerpted from *Sunset Magazine*)**

September is the time to:

- Add fall color to your garden with asters, chrysanthemums, gaillardia, gloriosa daisy, Japanese anemone, lion's tail, purple coneflower, and salvia.
- Shop soon for the best selection of healthy bulbs; choose firm ones without soft or moldy spots. Plant anemones, crocus, daffodils, Dutch iris, freesias, homeria, hyacinths, ixia, leucojum, lycoris, oxalis, Peruvian scilla, ranunculus, sparaxis, tritonia, tulips, and watsonia. (Some, such as freesias, homeria, and watsonia, are not hardy in zones 1 and 2.)
- In mild climates, chill crocus, hyacinths, and tulips in the refrigerator for about six weeks before planting, keeping them away from fruits and veggies, which can thwart bulb development.
- Set out calendula, forget-me-nots, Iceland and Shirley poppies, ornamental cabbage and kale, pansies, primrose, stock, sweet peas, and violas. In coastal areas, try cineraria, nemesia, and schizanthus.
- Give cool-season annuals a strong start by planting after mid-month in cooler areas and at the end of the month in warm inland locations (*Sunset* climate zones 7-9, 14-17). Keep the soil moist while plants develop and, if weather is hot, temporarily shade new seedlings
- Prune fig trees as soon as you harvest all their fruit. New figs soon develop at branch tips so if you wait too long to prune, you could prune off next year's crop.
- If plant leaves are a little dusty or covered with spider webs, spritz them with a sharp blast from the hose, early in the day.
- Check your irrigation system for leaks and uncapped lines. If you have overhead spray, turn it on to see that the heads are properly aimed.



HOW TO SUBMIT REVENUE AND EXPENSES**Launa Gould, CGCI Financial Secretary**

- Revenue – If you are a chairman that receives cash or checks, complete a Cash Receipts Report online or the three-part paper form.
 - ◊ Paper form: Send one copy to the Treasurer at PO Box 75, Graton, CA along with the checks. Mail or scan the paper copy and send to the Financial Secretary.
 - ◊ Online Form: It will automatically go to the Financial Secretary.
- Expenses – To be reimbursed for your expenses, complete a Request for Payment or Reimbursement form found online. Eligible expenses include printing, ink and supplies necessary for your position. Scan or mail form and receipts to the Financial Secretary. The address is on the form. Expenses are checked against your budget. A warrant will be sent to the Treasurer who will write the check.



Budgets are established for guidelines and limits on expenses. Know your budget and your Line Code. Line Codes help us to keep track of Revenue and Expenses. If you need help with line codes or procedures, please contact your Financial Secretary.


Membership Matters:

- ◇ What's the common factor in the headline? The word DUE. CGCI dues were due on July 1 and will be delinquent on October 1. That means clubs in arrears are at risk of losing eligibility for general liability insurance and the Group Tax Exemption Program (GTEP) as well as membership in CGCI and all the wonderful benefits that come with being a paid up member. Changes and fresh ideas in the CGCI Awards Program will ignite excitement and motivate you and your garden club to rekindle that love affair and to seize new opportunities!

CGCI Awards that had no entries over the past five years have been eliminated. Perhaps that is just a sign of a changing culture. With a changing culture comes the opportunity to build a bridge from *what was* to *what is*. And the bridge is AWARDS. Review ALL of the awards and let your mind to be open to new opportunities as you tailor (modernize) your club activities to meet the requirements of one or more awards.

An exciting bridge for the CGCI Awards Program is the overhaul of the National Garden Clubs (NGC) Awards Program. The result is an update to existing awards and the addition of new awards. California clubs are eligible for the new awards and you are encouraged to look for these new opportunities. CGCI first-place winners are automatically submitted to NGC by the CGCI Awards Chairman.





EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE VS. EXECUTIVE BOARD**Greg Pokorski, CGCI Parliamentarian**

A point of confusion I frequently see in bylaws of clubs and other organizations concerns the use of "executive board" and "executive committee." **These are not the same thing.**



- An executive committee (which is what CGCI, Pacific Region Garden Clubs, Inc. and National Garden Clubs, Inc. have) is "board within a board," usually made up of the officers and usually empowered to act in the place of the board of directors between board meetings – so it is a subset of the board of directors.
- An executive board is really just another name for the board of directors and is known as the board of directors in an organization that has an executive committee. When *Robert's* refers (page 482) to board of directors it will usually use the term *executive board*.

If your organization has a committee of officers who are part of the board of directors, but who may meet and conduct business separately from the entire board, do not call that committee the executive board. It is the executive committee.



- Mail check and form to the US Forest Service selected (no change here).


