Maryanne Lucas, CGCI President 2009-2011

It is with shock and sorrow that we mourn the loss of former CGCI President, club member, mentor and friend Maryanne Lucas. Maryanne passed away Thursday, December 7, after suffering a massive stroke.

Inspiring, insightful, indefatigable and dedicated, Maryanne was the epitome of purposeful persistence. She forged ever onward, virtually to the end.

Maryanne served in many capacities with her local club in Westlake Village, the Channel Islands District and CGCI. She created the CGCI website, designed many of the graphics

used in our promotional materials today and was a NGC Four-Star Member (completed all four NGC Schools). In addition to her work with garden clubs, she founded <u>Kids Growing Strong</u> (KGS) in 2001 with initial funding from a

grant and donations from a group of dedicated gardeners. It was also her president's project. Kids Growing Strong is an educational enrichment program that today reaches tens of thousands of children and their families each year.



Maryanne partnered with numerous other organizations; most recently *California Department of Food and Agriculture, Pollinator Posse* and the *Insect Sciences Museum of California*. She was involved with the *San Francisco Flower & Garden Show* and designed the <u>*Kids Adventure Garden* at</u></u> <u>the Conejo Valley Botanic Garden</u> in Thousand Oaks, CA.



We send our condolences to Maryanne's family and her colleagues, especially the core KGS staff. We are hopeful the KGS staff can carry Maryanne's work and legacy forward. She will be missed.

To quote Maryanne: "The best thing about garden clubs is that club members are never alone...and the work they do goes far beyond their reach. Like raindrops in a pond, garden club members are part of a much larger pool of people - some who occasionally make a big splash, but all create ripples that affect each other, contribute to the whole and carry on long after any single person is gone."

She is survived by husband, Bob, daughters Kristen Lucas and Annie Roller, son-in-law Brett Roller, three granddaughters and one grandson. Services will be for family only. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to KGS and mailed to Sue Bennett, 7560 Shelborne Drive, Granite Bay, CA 95746.
