There was an overwhelming response to the PLANT AMERICA Community Project Grants Program. 415 garden clubs applied in the first year of this new NGC program! This is wonderful that so many clubs are active in their communities.



This level of response shows the needs of NGC's clubs. One of

our roles as a national organization is to support our clubs in accomplishing our mission. NGC must do all it can to expand the funding for these grants to help clubs all across the country with their projects.

In order for this fund to increase so that NGC can give more grants, P. Allen Smith is providing a fundraising opportunity for PLANT AMERICA Grants. He offered his gardening and business advice and expertise for the plant selection, for obtaining the plants and for the method of distribution to our members. He believes in our organization's purpose and mission and has helped develop this promotion in many ways by giving his time, his staff's time and by donating a very generous percentage of the sales.

I am very proud to announce that **beginning March 1 and ending June 15, 2018** National Garden Clubs will be selling plants selected by P. Allen Smith. This promotion, entitled *Inspiring Gardens Across America*, includes three different collections of plants. Each item was chosen because of a special feature in its hybridization for performance or beauty or for its limited availability in the general marketplace.

- 1. **Peony Flowering Daylily Collection.** This collection includes three of the most prolific reblooming double-flowering daylilies.
- 2. **Sunpatiens® 'Razzle Dazzle' Collection.** This is not your grandmother's impatiens! SunPatiens® is a hybrid impatiens bred by Sakata. 


Center for the Families of the Fallen Excerpted from Keeping in Touch, February 2018

In 2010 the Delaware Federation of Garden Clubs (DFGC), proposed installing a private garden for the families who come to Dover Air Force Base to participate in the dignified transfer of their loved one. DFGC raised money for this garden, often in very creative and inspired ways. Major support was offered by Renee Blaschke, President of NGC at the time, sister garden clubs* from across the nation, The Longwood Foundation, and the Crystal Foundation. Many contractors and suppliers donated their services and materials. Members worked alongside military personnel to make the garden a reality.

On May 31, 2011, less than a year and a half after the idea was conceived, the garden was dedicated and "gifted to the Air Force." The DFGC also installed a Blue Star Memorial Marker in the garden - a very appropriate location. The DFGC arranges for the garden at the Center for Families of the Fallen to be maintained and cared for. The Federation is deeply grateful for each gift that made this garden and its care possible.

*CGCI was one of many state garden clubs supporting this project. In 2011 the CGCI board of directors approved matching funds of \$100 up to a total of \$5,000. Donations and matching funds totaling \$11,075 were sent to DFGC for this project. Thank you to all who participated. Julie West, CGCI President, 2011-13



The insurance certificates for the insurance year Feb. 15, 2018 to Feb. 15, 2019 should be received by each participating Garden Club and Associated Plant Society on or before March 1, 2018.

Here are some tips/reminder for requesting Additional Insured Certificates.

- The insurance company requires the <u>entire</u> copy of the rental contract with the venue.
- The contract must state that the facility <u>requires</u> the garden club/associated plant society add the facility to the liability coverage.
 - <u>Before submitting forms</u>, please reread the contract and do not assume that the facility is asking for an additional insured certificate when your club agrees to the rental contract.
- The contract does not have to be signed. The insurance company reviews the contract to make sure there are not any other insurance needs in the contract.

Send requests for additional insurance to the CGCI Liability Chairman and be sure to include:

- A check for \$35.00 payable to CGCI.
- A copy of the ENTIRE facility contract/Rental Agreement.
- CGCI'S CERTIFICATE ENDORSEMENT FORM requesting an additional insured certificate. Fill in the required information.

Mail to CGCI's Liability Chairman (the address is on the CGCI CERTIFICATE ENDORSEMENT Form). Watch for future information in the *Golden Gardens News* regarding liability insurance questions.
