

### Apply For CGCI Photo Awards 2018 By B.J. Doerfling, Photography Chairmen

Do you take photos of public or private gardens including your own? Have you considered applying for a CGCI Photography Award? All rules and forms are available on the CGCI website, <u>www.californiagardenclubs.com/awards</u>.

The numbering of the awards changed in 2017. The **Wildflower Photo Award** is now number 25D and the **Arboretum/Botanic Garden Photo Collection** is now number 41. Both of these awards require a book of evidence and all the requirements are available online.

- Award #40 is the easiest and the most popular to enter. It is for a single photo in one of a variety of flower/plant categories: 1. Your own garden, 2. A cactus/ succulent you grow, 3. Your own rose, 4. A flowering tree/shrub you grow, and 5. One photo of a California arboretum or botanic garden. You can enter up to two photos in each of these five categories.
- Submission:
  - ◊ Insert a 5" x 7" or 8" x 10" photo into a plastic page protector
  - On the reverse side insert a CGCI Awards Application Form. Include award number and name, submitted by, date, name of club and district *plus* data requested on the Evaluation Form for Award #40. For example: if you submit a rose photo describe where and how it is grown, the name and the type of rose, be it a hybrid tea, miniature, etc.
  - An Evaluation Form (used for judging) is also submitted with each entry and it too is available online...just fill out your information at the bottom of the page, place it in an envelope and insert it also into the plastic page protector. All entries need to be postmarked by **Dec. 1, 2018**.

### MAMMILLARIA PECTINIFERA

This is a beautiful, distinctive little mammillaria. Its tightly packed tubercules and comb-like spines on a short cylindrical stem give it an overall white appearance. The flowers are whitish to shell pink, 2-3 cm. in diameter. *Mammillaria pectinifera* is native to two small areas in the state of Puebla, Mexico. It has for years been considered threatened in habitat due to mining of rock for construction, rubbish dumping, cattle grazing and illegal collecting. A 2017 research study found genetic problems in the extant population which could





lead to its extinction. The species is protected from export on Appendix I of CITES. Some books describe the species as hard to grow. However, Elton Roberts writes: "I keep the plants dry over the winter in regular soil mix. Since getting rid of the limestone and changing from alkaline water to acidic water the plants have grown very well. Give a good watering and then allow the soil to dry before watering again. Give the plants good light and a little shading from the afternoon heat. The white spines reflect most of the heat back away from the body and the bright light keeps the plant growing good with nice dense spines.
