This beautiful spring-blooming native perennial is found in moist areas along the coast and inland. Grow in full sun to partial shade. Once established, it tolerates moderate to little water. In addition to being a nectar plant for the

mission blue butterflies, it is a larval/host plant for the West Coast Lady, Painted Lady, Common Checkered Skipper and Gray Hairstreak butterflies.

### Blue Star Memorial Marker



A Blue Star Memorial Marker sponsored by Southern California Garden Club was installed at the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library (the first such marker at any Presidential Library) days before the Reagan National Defense Forum during which the F-117 Nighthawk stealth fighter exhibit was launched. Our marker was on display for thousands who attended that special event.

Southern California Garden Club held an official unveiling and dedication of the marker on December 11 with the cooperation and support of the Reagan Library staff, who provided seating, audio equipment, refreshments, a singer and ad-

mittance to the Library for attendees of the dedication. Presentation of the Colors was by Civil Air Patrol Challenger Squadron 1986. Patrick Mayoral from Santa Susanna High School sang the National Anthem and God Bless America. San Fernando Valley District Director Harriet Vallens delivered a message from CGCI President Shane Looper. CGCI Blue Star Memorial Markers Co-Chairman George Unrine presented the history of the Blue Star project. Pacific Region Director Robin Pokorski delivered remarks on behalf of the region and read the poem The Ragged Old Flag. Diane Franchini (from Ellensburg, Washington), Chairman of the Pacific Region Director's Project ("Blue Stars Shine in the Pacific Region") spoke about the project, presented a Region certificate and announced that this was the first California marker dedication of this administration. Club President Greg Pokorski unveiled the marker (with Melissa Giller, Chief Marketing Officer for the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute) and presented dedication remarks and certificates from National Garden Clubs, Inc. Jennifer Culp, the club's Blue Star Chairman, laid a memorial wreath made by club member Sherry Molinari (and provided much assistance in coordinating details with the Library). Gail Vanderhorst read God Bless the U.S.A. and Hank Vanderhorst gave the benediction.

Southern California Garden Club is proud to honor the men and women who have served, are serving and will serve in our armed forces in this beautiful hilltop location and at such a prestigious venue where it will be seen by the many visitors to the Library.

#### Arbor Week Planning Kit

Arbor Day was created by J. Sterling Morton and celebrated in Nebraska on April 10, 1872 by planting an estimated one million trees on the treeless prairie. Since its inception, Arbor Day has been created around the nation as a day to plant and care for trees. California Arbor Week now starts on March 7, Luther Burbank's Birthday, and continues until March 14. Clubs and Districts are encouraged to dedicate a tree any time of the year.

## **Interesting Tree Facts**

- In 1881, in Yosemite National Park, a tunnel was built through the Wawona "Tunnel" tree. It was so big that people could drive their carriages later their cars right through. The 2,100-year-old tree fell in 1969 under heavy snowfall (some blame the tunnel's damage). Today, there are three other privately owned tunnel trees that charge a fee to drive through. On January 8, 2017, a massive storm brought down Pioneer Cabin Tree, a popular tunnel tree that the California Department of Parks and Recreation estimated at 100 feet tall.
- A fallen coast redwood will often send up new shoots, growing new trees off of its trunk. This is called a candelabra tree.
- Redwoods and giant sequoias were used to build many of the original buildings in San Francisco, Oakland, and Sacramento in the latter 1800s.
- Redwoods and giant sequoias are adept at though by no means immune to — surviving fire. Their bark contains no flammable pitch or resin and is extremely thick.
