Blue Star Marker Restoration Update

Our long-awaited Blue Star Memorial restorations are going to have to wait a bit longer. As I'm sure you are all aware, just as our restorer, Tom Stelling, was about to leave Florida for his trip to the west coast, the COVID-19 pandemic hit the United States. For the safety of he and his wife, Tom decided they would have to wait to start their trip. The weeks of our Stay-In-Place order turned into months and now the weather has turned much warmer. Tom wears a leather suit when he strips the markers, so he plans his trips to accommodate the changing seasons. He now says that he will be coming to us in the early spring of 2021.

This change might be a benefit to your club and/or your district. You now have additional time to survey near-by Blue Star Memorials to see if they should be restored. The cost is \$750 to do the large Memorial markers and \$400 to do the smaller By-way markers in place. If the By-way marker is taken to the site of a Memorial marker restoration, then the cost is only \$250. I doubt if we will have a professional restorer come our way anytime soon again, so this is a good opportunity to make our Blue Stars Shine! Project Mission Blue - Phase II

CGCI is entering the last year of this five-year partnership with *Golden Gate National Park Conservancy* project extended in 2016 and originally adopted in 2011. Phase II propagates and plants twelve California native nectar plants to assist the federally endangered mission blue butterfly. Adult mission blue butterflies are typically poor flyers and use these nectar sources that ensure suitable habitat exists in between patches of host larval lupines.



Ithuriel's spear (*Triteleia laxa*) featured here is one of the twelve nectar plants being propagated in Phase II: It is easy to grow in a dry garden and will tolerate some summer water. It ranges in height from 6 - 24 inches in full sun to partial shade. Shades of purple and blue trumpet-shaped flowers bloom in spring on slender stalks above leaves. Combine these bulbs with native grasses and in containers.

We thank **Chuck Goodwin**, **Walnut Creek Garden Club** and **West Valley Garden Club** for their generous contributions since the March 2020 issue. \$1,326 has been received since July 1, 2019 and a total of \$5,593.00 since July 1, 2016. This exciting project is made possible because of people like you and the charitable donations that you make in any amount. We appreciate your financial support to help the population of this endangered species survive.
