Honoring California Students

CONGRATULATIONS to four CGCI Scholarship winners who receive \$2,000 each toward pursuing their educational goals!

The **Robert L. Gordon Scholarship** is awarded to **Taylor Rein,** a sophomore applying for his junior year, majoring in Environmental Science at UC Berkeley. He is a student employee at UC Berkeley Botanical Garden and an active volunteer leading the "Save the Bees" campaign to enrich the campus landscape to sustain native bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. His efforts were successful when UC Berkeley was recognized as the 80th Bee Campus in the nation by Bee Campus USA in Sept. 2019.

One of the two CGCI 2017-2019 President's Project Scholarships recipients is **Samantha Spurlin**, a graduate student at San Jose State University majoring in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology with a minor in Plant Physiology. Her graduate research focuses on comparing 2011 pre-drought and 2015 post-drought generations of a rare California native wildflower, San Francisco Collinsia.

We have just learned that two California students have each been awarded a **\$4,000** scholarship from *National Garden Clubs:* Borah Lim and Natalie Fulton. Both students have superlative academic records and great financial need. These two amazing young women are truly deserving of our encouragement and it is an honor to have them recognized by both CGCI with a \$2,000 scholarship and then with a \$4,000 scholarship from NGC.

Borah Lim is a graduate student at UC Davis studying International Agricultural Development and is CGCI's recipient of the **Krystal Migliore Scholarship**. One of her professors calls her a "boundary spanner" for her desire to educate the public on agriculture, technical issues regarding soil and the importance of having access to fresh food.

Natalie Fulton is a junior at UC Berkeley studying Forestry and Natural Resources and minoring in Geo-spatial Information Science and Technology. (GIS is a discipline which uses many forms of technology to study land and changes that occur). She hopes to get a graduate degree in Forestry and GIS and then work as a Registered Professional Forester (RPF). Natalie received the second of the two CGCI 2017-2019 President's Project Scholarships awarded.

Successful Gardening School during COVID-19

Congratulations to Berni Hendrix and Valley Lode District for the successful execution and completion of California Series 26 of NGC's Gardening School. All four courses took place from mid-February to mid-April. After the first two courses took place in the classroom in Turlock, COVID-19 reared its ugly head. The sponsoring district did not want its preparation to go to waste or to leave the students on hold, so they quickly figured out how to conduct the school by Zoom and the last two courses took place as virtual courses on the originally scheduled dates. I was among those who spent a weekend (April 18 & 19) at our computers to attend Course 4, attending along with NGC Gardening Schools Chairman Barbara Hadsell and Josephine Goodenow (formerly from California and formerly a member and chairman of our Consultants Council) who is the NGC Gardening Schools Accrediting Chairman for our region, to monitor the virtual school experience for possible further use by NGC. Subsequent NGC meetings have tapped into Valley Lode District's pioneering efforts, developing guidelines for other NGC schools to be able to utilize Zoom as a Plan B option during this time of safer at home meeting and travel restrictions.

The course was quite a success, thanks to Dale Pollard, the engaging and informative instructor, and thanks to the organizational skills of Berni Hendrix and her helpers. The curriculum and class hours were exactly the same as for a traditional in-the-classroom course. This opportunity put all attendees in touch with gardening during this period when it has been difficult to share the gardening experience and information with others.

Fifty individuals attended at least some portion of the school's four courses. This school produced 18 new Gardening Consultants – one from Maryland and the remainder from California – and 10 new Provisional Gardening Consultants. Congratulations to these new California Gardening Consultants: Bonnie Bundesen, Deborah Clipper, Diane Davis, Manjeet Dosanjh, Rachel Dyer, Rose Kennedy, Linda King, Tammy Lucich, Sandy Mann, Diane Mendoza, Sherry Molinari, Susie Nystrom, Olga Psomostithis, Penny Peters, Judy Sylvester, Bob Taylor and Linda Zier.
