Sempervirens Fund

Big Basin Recovery Fund is a separate fund within Sempervirens. It was created to repair extensive damage to forest and structures, done by the August 2020 CZU Lightning Complex Wildfire.

In January 2021, CGCI encouraged members to match \$5000 donated by CGCI. When members' donations met the first \$5000 in matching funds, a second \$5000 in matching funds was approved in May of 2021. Presently, \$9,734.60 has been donated by members and \$5000 by CGCI for a total of \$14,734.60. Only a few hundred dollars are needed to receive the second \$5000 CGCI matching funds for a total of \$20,000. Donations to this fund will continue after the \$20,000 goal is met.

Your donations to Sempervirens over the years have helped protect the coastal Redwood forests. Now, when Big Basin Redwoods State Park is meeting its greatest challenge, members of CGCI have shown their willingness to help save this California treasure.


