

# Group Tax Exemption Program (GTEP) Annual Renewal

**GTEP Annual Renewal** notices will be emailed to the email addresses on file for club treasurers and presidents/directors as of September 7. It does not come from my personal email, but from California Garden Clubs, Inc., cgci@cagardenclubs.org. To ensure receipt add cgci@cagardenclubs.org. to your address book or create a filter to accept all mail from this address. If you have not received an email containing GTEP paperwork by September 15, 2022, send an email to this chairman at gtep@cagardenclubs.org. Also check your Spam and Trash folders.

The Annual Renewal Form and cover letter have been shortened to make it easier for you. **Do not change the dates on the form.** In an effort for CGCI to comply with IRS and FTB dates, CGCI must work a year in advance. You are sending in information for the year you just finished; however, you are paying to be in the Program in the future. Fee remains the same: **Nonrefundable Fees** — **Renewal**: Postmarked prior to February 1, 2023, \$15.00. **Renewal Late Fee**: Postmarked after February 1, \$30.00.

All GTEP information and forms are available on the website. Go to <u>https://www.californiagardenclubs.com/gtep</u>. On that page you will find links to the GTEP Handbook, Renewal Forms, List of GTEP member clubs, ALL California Charity related guidelines and forms (Registration Renewal Fee Report-RRF-1, Annual Treasurer's Report-CT-TR-1, Raffle Registration-ct-nrp-1, Raffle Report-ct-nrp-2) IRS guidelines and webpages.

NOTE: The application fee to register raffles has increased to \$30. For specific questions, work directly with your accountant.

And don't forget your annual filings are due November 15.

### **Black Point Gardens**

After our explosive spring bloom this April and May, the Black Point historic gardens have settled into a summer of maintenance and preparation for the incoming planting season. With the help of our incredible volunteers, and thanks to your generous donation, we were able to plant about 200 native plants and "nativars" in the gardens this month and plan for many more in the Fall/Winter season when we do most of our planting.

Educating the next generation of environmental stewards is a big part of our work at the Parks Conservancy. We had the wonderful opportunity to host three summer interns who have spent the last three months learning about garden maintenance and principals, engaging with the history and context of our work, and practicing leading public programs in the gardens. With the school year starting, we are preparing for a continuation of our partnership with Galileo High School's AP Environmental Science program. Last year we were able to bring 60 students into the gardens every other week for outdoor science learning.

If you haven't gotten a chance to volunteer with our program yet, be sure to do so this Fall or Winter! We will be doing a lot of planting in the gardens and will need support keeping invasive species at bay. Our weekly volunteer days are Thursdays 2pm-5:45pm and Fridays 9am-noon. # COVID-Related Blue Star Memorial Information

The NGC Blue Star Markers Chairman did some checking for us on a California order that was submitted this spring. She found out that Sewah Studios is in the same situation as many other businesses. That is, they are having problems with supply, transportation, and employee issues, and they are backed up. Production is now taking up to six months instead of the three months pre-COVID. The cost of shipping the markers has greatly increased, so be prepared to pay extra for shipping. If your club or district is planning on purchasing a marker in the next year or so, plan on a six-month wait for it to be shipped to you. It might be a good idea to decide on your dedication date after you have your marker in your possession. I don't want to discourage anyone from ordering a new Blue Star Memorial, I just want you to know that for the foreseeable future, everything is not as it used to be.
