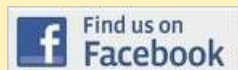

## From the President's desk...

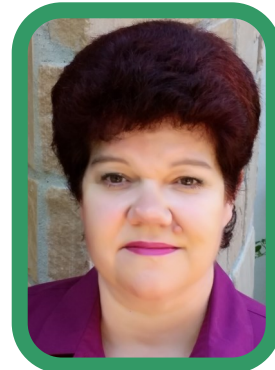
I'm honored and excited to be the 44<sup>th</sup> CGCI President. I look forward to meeting everyone over the next two years and together let's have some fun. The theme for 2015-2017 is *Growing Minds, Planting Seeds*.

During the next two years we need to grow within our organization, start "planting seeds" (mentoring others for moving up the chairs, teaching our members and others about CGCI) and grow our contacts outside CGCI.

Wouldn't it be great to have an organization/company approach CGCI and say, "Wow you have a great program, what can we do to help support you (financially or with a project they propose)". When was the last time this happened? I would love it if someone said, "Sue, we heard all about CGCI...come to our meeting and tell us more about CGCI and how can we get involved?"

My President's Project for the next two years is *Encouraging Future Gardeners*. CGCI has been supporting youth gardening groups in California since 1931 and the goals and development are consistent with those of National Garden Clubs. The goal of this project is to raise awareness of CGCI by distributing an *"Encouraging Future Gardeners Kit."*

A letter promoting CGCI and a questionnaire will be sent to established youth organizations such as 4-H, Future Farmers of America (FFA), Scouts, Camp Fire, after school programs, Community Gardens and CGCI youth groups. The kit will contain donated seeds, printed instructions, a fabric pot and a reporting form. Ideas on how children can make their own pot(s) using recycled material will also be included, thus the child can learn the art of growing plants while being eco-friendly. Project starts July 1, more details to follow. If you know of a group, please forward their name to the CGCI Youth Chairman.

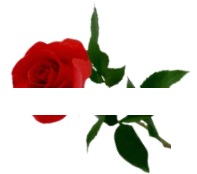

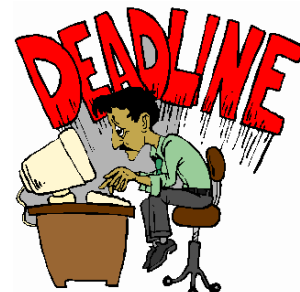

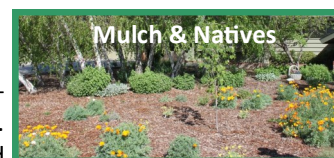
On May 5 the Chula Vista Garden Club was presented with a **CLEAN Champion Award** from the Chula Vista Resource Conservation Commission. The CLEAN Champion program is an annual tradition that celebrates local environmental champions. Joan Gerber and her team have been instrumental in weeding and replanting several planter boxes at both library branches and at City Hall. In addition, club members have participated in the Mosaic Community Garden located at 960 Fifth Ave., planted trees at the Chula Vista Veterans Home, and

participated in planting and cleaning up in Rice Canyon. Most recently a tree was planted for Arbor Day in the newly built off-leash Dog Park at Eucalyptus Park. For the past 20 years, the garden club has donated scholarship funds to deserving Southwestern College students pursuing horticulture-related careers. For this group, beautification extends to their own homes where more than 85% of club members have qualified to receive Wildlife Habitat Certification.

### Sequoia Garden Club - Sequoia Foothills District

In March, the club held a "Lawn-free" Garden Tour featuring five Visalia gardens with different approaches to provide attendees with tangible and attractive options to landscaping without a lawn. The five garden "themes" were Rocks, Hardscape, Mulch and Natives, Cacti and Succulents, and Faux Turf. Plant ID labels were prepared for unusual plants to enhance the educational part of the tour. Comprehensive plant lists were also prepared for each garden and were made available to interested tour-goers. Local Master Gardeners volunteered their time by staffing a table to be an information resource for those interested in Central Valley-style landscaping. The Ornamental Horticulture Club of a local community college also augmented the tour's theme by offering a plant sale of drought tolerant plants and vegetables.

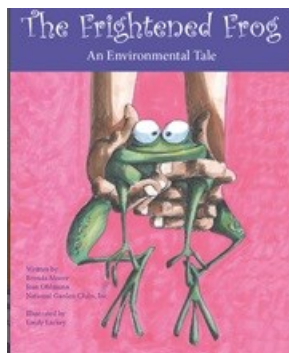

## HORTICULTURE HAPPENINGS

### OOPS, WE DID IT AGAIN

Yes, it's happened again. Because it has happened again, friends don't make eye contact. Acquaintances cross the street and pretend they don't see you. Neighbors don't open their doors. What is this thing that happened? Well, it is zucchini season and once again we have planted way too many of them. Fifteen plants, as a matter of fact. Zucchini everywhere. Yikes!

I have become quite the magician. When friends, acquaintances and neighbors see me coming again with a determined look in my eyes and a bag of squash in my hands, they disappear. I can seemingly produce zucchini out of thin air when I meet a stranger. Before they are aware of what is happening, they have an armful of squash and I am happily on my way. What is it about a zucchini that one morning it is six inches long and if you don't pick it right away, the next day it is as big as a baseball bat. As an interesting fact, the longest zucchini on record was grown in Ontario, Canada on October 22, 2005 and was 7 feet, 10.3 inches long.

To cut down on an over abundance of squash, they say the blossoms can be picked and fried. I tried that, and by the time I washed them to make sure all the bugs were out, they were a sodden mess and unfryable. I could not even use them for garnish. Picking the blossoms did murder quite a few squash though. I still had another plan. Plan B was giving the blossoms and leaves to my tortoise, named Tommy, but he didn't know he was supposed to like them. He warily sniffed them and ambled away. Another failure. The plants just keep on producing no matter what I do.

Zucchini, or *Cucurbita pepo*, a member of the cucumber and melon family, originated in the Americas thousands of years ago, but the squash called zucchini we know now is a variety developed in Italy. It means "little squash" in Italian. Zucchini is treated as a vegetable, but botanically it is a fruit. The first records of zucchini in the United States were in the 1920's, probably brought over by Italian immigrants. It was little known or used in the United States until the early 1970's when it was made popular by "The Classic Italian Cook Book" written by an Italian American chef, Marcella Hazan. The zucchini is now the jewel of summer squashes and easily grown in our area. What is that noise I hear? It is the back door quietly closing. I go in the kitchen to check. My husband has sneakily brought in a big basket of, what else, zucchini and he has made himself scarce. I told you I was a magician and could make people disappear.

"It was an itty-bitsy, teeny-weeny, silver striped green zucchini; while we slumbered, what went wrong? Overnight it's two feet long; the giant, flesh-eating zucchini, or so my children say, is on the loose in the garden and they're not going back today; and what's more, they swore, they'll never eat it again anymore." 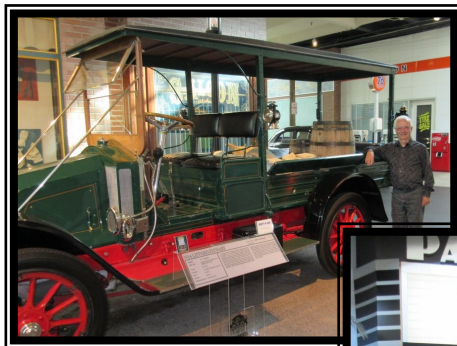

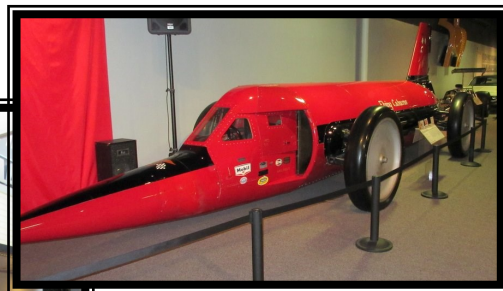
