#### **CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP**

Note: A plant society may join as a club, associate plant society, or affiliate.

All member organizations are automatically members of National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) and the Pacific Region Garden Clubs, Inc. of NGC. (eight western states)

#### • CLUB: A club shall:

- o pay annual dues of \$2.75 per capita (NEW clubs joining January 1-June 30 pay one half annual dues for the initial period through June 30.)
- o belong to a district\*
- o be eligible to apply for CGCI liability insurance and the CGCI Group Tax Exemption Program, and
- o be eligible to participate in the CGCI awards program.

#### • ASSOCIATE PLANT SOCIETY: An associate plant society shall:

- o be a member of a permanent statewide or national plant society,
- o pay annual dues of \$2.75 per capita, (NEW APS joining January 1-June 30 pay one half annual dues for the initial period through June 30.)
- o be entitled to representation at the CGCI annual meeting by its president or alternate, and delegates,
- o be eligible to apply for CGCI liability insurance and
- o **NOT** be eligible to apply for the CGCI Group Tax Exemption Program.
- o (may) also belong to a district\* (optional please note separate district dues may apply)

#### AFFILIATE: An affiliate shall:

- o be an organization with one or more of the objectives of CGCI,
- o have a membership of at least ten members,
- opay annual dues of \$50 regardless of size,
- o be approved by the CGCI Board of Directors, and
- o **NOT** be eligible for CGCI's liability insurance (including Directors' & Officers), awards program or Group Tax Exemption Program.
- o (may) belong to a district\* (optional please note separate district dues may apply)

#### \*DISTRICTS

- CGCI is organized into 28 geographic districts
- Each has its own district director, officers, committees, bylaws, meetings and dues.
  - o District directors attend state board meetings and are the liaison between CGCI and local organizations
- Districts may set dues that are separate from CGCI membership dues
  - District dues may be per capita or per club/plant society
  - o These dues help defray the expenses of the district
- Clubs are required to belong to a district
- Plant Societies and affiliates have the option of belonging to a district

#### LIABILITY INSURANCE

- The CGCI liability insurance plan is available to clubs and plant societies.
- Coverage is for investigation, legal defense, bodily injury and property damage due to the negligence of the club or any of its members during any meeting or event (flower show, garden tour) controlled by the club,
- Coverage is limited to \$1,000,000 per accident, with an aggregate of \$2,000,000 for all groups.
- A new club or plant society may be added to the policy at the time they join CGCI. A full year's premium will be charged. Subsequent premiums are due on January 15 for the insurance year, which begins on February 15.

#### PROCEDURE FOR MEMBERSHIP

- Review the Classes of Membership and select the option applicable to your organization

- Upon receipt of application, a welcome letter, CGCI Directory and free promotional materials will be forwarded to the president.
  - O Clubs will receive annual membership cards for their individual members.
  - O Associate plant societies may receive individual membership cards upon request
  - Affiliates receive one membership card for their records.
- The club, associate plant society, or affiliate will be presented for ratification at the CGCI board meeting or convention following the application date. These meetings are usually held in September, February and June.
- Eligibility:
  - Any garden club, plant society or other organization having one or more of the objectives of CGCI shall be eligible for membership providing no sectarian, racial, or political test for membership is required.
  - o Bylaws of each membership class shall not conflict with the bylaws of CGCI.
  - O No commercial enterprise or agency shall be eligible for membership.

California Garden Clubs, Inc. (CGCI) is a non-profit association of garden organizations devoted to the development of all phases of gardening, beautification of the community, and conservation of natural resources.

The objectives are set forth in the bylaws, printed annually in the CGCI Directory.
