We are all looking forward to enjoying the beauty nature brings (with our help) this time of year! Hopefully we have seen the end of torrential rain, snow, destructive winds, mud slides, etc.

I have just returned from the Pacific Region Convention in Lynnwood, Washington (Seattle area). Other than the host state, we had the most attendees with 15 members present.



Our new Pacific Region Director is Carol Norquist from Alaska. Her theme is "Unleash the Wild: Bring Nature Home". In her opening remarks she stressed that of the 4000 species of native bees, 50% are in decline and other pollinators (butterflies, moths, bats, birds, beetles, insects) are also under threat. She reminded us that we must learn to live in the midst of nature for the future good of the earth and that even small steps (such as planting containers with wild flowers) have a huge cumulative effect. Her objective is for us to educate ourselves and others and to do something to help the natural world. She is encouraging our participation in Homegrown National Park.

I have been appointed as the new Awards Chairman for the region. This year at the Awards Banquet I accepted 38 certificates for your great work. The region has a separate Foto Fundraiser contest and the Southern California Garden Club won \$100 for their entry. Congratulations to everyone!

The June Golden Gardens will be available mid-month to allow me to report on the 2021-23 term and on NGC and CGCI Conventions. I hope you have registered and contacted the hotel to attend our exciting CGCI Convention in Thousand Oaks on June 5-9. 

Clubs, Who are Your Official Convention Representatives?

Every CGCI garden club and associate plant society is entitled to representation at the CGCI annual meeting (convention). This is your opportunity to see how your organization is being run and to participate in its administration, and an opportunity to network with fellow members from all over California, learn from the workshops and programs provided, and get ideas from other clubs.

Member organizations are entitled to representation by their presidents (or the president's alternate) **and** by delegates (the number of official delegates is based on the size of the membership of each club as specified in CGCI's bylaws). Delegates should be elected by each club – or at the least, be appointed (usually by the president). Club members cannot just fill out registration forms designating themselves as delegates. For every registration form that indicates the attendee is a president, alternate or delegate there needs to be a credentials form from that club verifying this information. See instructions that were included with the Call to Convention (distributed by email on April 17 and posted on the CGCI website). One credentials form is submitted online **(by May 19)**, usually by the president, by each club that is sending representatives. Delegates should be those who plan to attend convention business sessions where they have the opportunity to vote on behalf of their club.

Be involved in your parent organization. Attend the CGCI convention and take information and ideas back to your club. And let us know you are coming by being sure that your club has submitted its credentials form.

Districts, Who Will Represent You on the 2023-2025 Nominating Committee? By Greg Pokorski, Parliamentarian

Every two years CGCI elects new officers and a new Nominating Committee to identify candidates for the administration that will begin two years later. All Districts are entitled to be represented on this committee.

The manner in which representatives are elected this year depends on the outcome of a proposed bylaws amendment that would make some changes to this process. See the Nominating Committee information that was sent with the Call to Convention

Nominating Committee and see Bylaws Proposal #3 Bylaw Proposals

Under either method, this is each club's and district's opportunity to have a voice in the selection of our future leaders. Members of the CGCI Nominating Committee will be members of the CGCI Board of Directors and will be expected to attend the four board meetings and two conventions of the 2023-2025 term (especially all Nominating Committee meetings). Who from your club or district is willing to serve? Nominees must have served on the CGCI board of directors and be present at the convention when they are nominated. Those who have served report that this is great learning experience. Prepare for your club or district to be represented in determining CGCI's future. Identify candidates to serve on this most important committee. If you have questions about the Nominating Committee, ask questions and/or review the CGCI bylaws now. **Be ready to nominate and elect members of our Nominating Committee at the upcoming convention.**

Tree Planting Ceremony

Application Procedure Timeline:

Plant America Community Project Grant applications are open to NGC member clubs from April 1 through October 15 of the calendar year to fund new or continuing projects carried out during the following year.

Committee member review applications and notify grant recipients in December.

Funds are released in January or February for projects to be implemented during that year. Project completion must be within approximately one year, but no later than February 28th of the year after funds are received.
