Thank you to Palm to Pines and Humboldt Districts for your invitations to visit in May and especially to my wonderful hosts, Pat Clayes, Ron Lang and Maria Kreneck. I attended our every decade dedication of a CGCI President's Tree in Big Basin which was ably organized by Rosa Radicchi and Judy Unrine. Thanks so much to them and to my host Roseann Costabile. I have attended two



great conventions in the past month: NGC in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia and CGCI in Thousand Oaks. Rita Desilets produced a fun-filled, high energy, informative, collegial convention including a tour of the Reagan Library. Thank you to Southern California Garden Club for hosting!

I have had an amazing two years as your CGCI President; thank you so much for entrusting our great organization to my care. My favorite part of this job was visiting clubs and districts to meet members and hear about the great things happening state-wide. I was lucky to visit via Zoom or in person with 3/4ths of the districts; thank you for your invitations. 2021-2023 accomplishments were making organizational changes to increase our effectiveness including conducting monthly Touch Base meetings for the Executive Committees, holding monthly meetings of the Bylaws & Policy and Strategic Planning Committees, making it easier to change policy, redesigning the Directory, changing the way the Nominating Committee is elected and the process for choosing their chairman, holding half of our state board meetings via Zoom, initiating two new state projects, redesigning and printing a new membership brochure, changing the percentages to increase the host's share of convention profits, increasing state recognition for leaders, establishing a Technology Committee, producing two up-to-date specific sets of procedures for hosting state board meetings and for hosting conventions, initiating the "open space" program at meetings, increasing the effectiveness of the Bylaws & Policy Committee by allowing chairing by the Parliamentarian, establishing two new scholarships, dividing the duties of the Communications Director, reorganizing the duties of the Corresponding Secretary, specifically inviting Club Presidents and Treasurers to attend board meetings and providing targeted workshops for them, increasing the Circle of Poppies, and changing standing rules and bylaws to streamline the change process for governance documents making us more nimble in responding to new developments. A pivotal change was the major redesign of our website, making it ADA compliant, and producing guidelines for clubs for ADA website compliance.

We educated members by sponsoring a state flower show, Flower Show Symposium, Gardening School, Landscape Design School, Environmental School, Tri-Refresher, and by producing monthly Golden Gardens eNews, daily Facebook posts and website updates. We provided training on insurance, group tax exemption, Parliamentary Procedure, fundraising, taxes, membership, floral design and leadership lessons on mentoring, consensus building, conflict resolution, website use and finding future leaders.
