HORTICULTURE NOTES: GEORGINA PACE SAGE (SALVIA OFFICIALIS)

There are hundreds of sage species, as well as many hybrids and selections



with an ever-widening range of temperature tolerances, flower and foliar colors, with or without floral or leaf fragrance. Despite their differences, there are similarities: all bear two-lipped flowers arranged in tight or loose spirals around square stems. Endemic to the Mediterranean, Garden Sage (Salvia officinalis) is the sage of choice for culinary and medicinal

purposes and can root wherever their stems rest on the soil.

Garden sage can be planted from seed, cuttings, or nursery stock in spring, or in autumn where winters are mild. If planted directly in the ground, provide full sun in well-draining soil with good air circulation. After flowering, cut sage back 20 percent and when new growth begins again, prune about 50 percent or just above fresh growth. When plant becomes woody with sparce growth, consider replacing it with a new plant.

Garden sage does well planted in containers using a commercial cactus to a sunny border, planted *en masse* along pathways, or near windows or doors, where their aroma can be appreciated. Resource: <u>California Getting Started Garden Guide</u>, Bruce and Sharon Asakawa, 2013.
