

GENERAL RULES OF THE SHOW

- **1.** This Flower Show conforms to the standards set by the National Garden Clubs, Inc *Handbook for Flower Shows, 2017 Edition, plus revisions*. This schedule is the law of the show.
- **2.** Competition is open to any amateur gardener or designer. There is no fee.
- **3.** Horticultural entry cards will be available from the Horticulture Entries Chair and should be filled out in pencil or waterproof ink.
- **4.** Entries in the Design Division must be pre-registered by Friday, October 6, with the Design Entries Chair as space is limited. The Design Entries Chair will prepare all entry cards for all design classes and give them to the design exhibitors at acceptance of entry.
- 5. Horticulture and Design entries will be accepted Friday, October 13 from 2-5:30 PM.
- **6.** <u>Judging will begin</u> at 9:30 AM on Saturday, October 14. Only the Judges, General Chairs, Horticultural Classification Chair and Clerks will be allowed on the floor during judging.
- **7.** Judging will be done by NGC Accredited Judges per the NGC Standard System of Awarding in the Handbook.
- **8.** Judges will sign, date and write 90+, if merited, on entry cards.
- **9.** A General Chair and the Classification Chairs must be available during all judging for possible consultations.
- **10.** The Classification Chairs for Horticulture and Design must review all entries for proper identification and conformity to the schedule.
- **11.** The decision of the judges is final. Awards may be withheld if not merited.
- **12.** Plants on the state's endangered or conservation plant lists must be grown by the exhibitor or collected in a legal manner and so identified: Plants on the state's invasive plant list, link below, will be so marked. www.cal-ipc.org/plants/profiles/
- **13.** There must be an emphasis on fresh plant material. No artificial plant material will be allowed in any division.
- **14.** Exhibits must be removed from 4 to 5 PM on Sunday, October 15 or from 11:30 AM until 3pm on Monday, October 16.
- **15.** The PLGC will strive to ensure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but is not responsible for any loss or damages to exhibits.

NGC AND PLGC AWARDS

NGC Award of Horticultural Excellence (green/blue/orange rosette) may be awarded to a botanically named blue ribbon exhibit scoring 95 or more.

NGC Award of Merit (orange rosette) may be awarded to a Horticulture Section A botanically named blue ribbon exhibit scoring 95 or more.

NGC Arboreal Award (green rosette) may be awarded to a Horticulture Section B botanically named blue ribbon exhibit scoring 95 or more.

NGC Award of Design Excellence (gold rosette) may be awarded to a blue ribbon exhibit in the Design Division scoring 95 or more.

NGC Petite Award (pale blue/white rosette) may be awarded to a blue ribbon exhibit in Design Section A scoring 95 or more.

NGC Designer's Choice Award (purple rosette) may be awarded to a blue ribbon exhibit in Design Section B scoring 95 or more.

NGC Class Awards

Only one first place (blue) ribbon per class scoring 90 points or above

Only one second place (red) ribbon per class scoring 85 points or above

Only one third place (yellow) ribbon per class scoring 80 points or above

One or more honorable mention (white) ribbon scoring 75 points or above

PLGC Awards: A **President's Excellence Award (yellow rosette)** will be awarded by the co-Presidents to an exhibit determined by them to be the best in the Design Division and the best in the Horticulture Division. These two exhibits may differ from those exhibits awarded NGC Awards by the Accredited Flower Show Judges.

DIVISION I - HORTICULTURE - RULES

- 1. All plant material must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- **2**. Plant material may not be altered by the application (treatment) of oil, commercial "shine" products, etc. that artificially change the natural color and texture.
- **3**. An exhibitor may make more than one entry per class if each entry is a different species, variety, cultivar, type or color.
- **4**. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line except for gladioli.
- **5**. The Classification Chairman has the authority to subdivide classes as necessary.
- **6**. The Scale of Points for Judging Horticulture is on page 14 of this schedule.
- **7**. All specimens should be correctly labeled with scientific (botanical) names or the currently accepted scientific identification for their educational value. Common name may also be added and enclosed in parentheses under the scientific name.
- **8**. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award (Award of Horticultural Excellence, Award of Merit, Arboreal Award), the exhibitor must identify their entry by its binomial name or currently acceptable scientific designation.
- **9**. All entry cards should be filled out in advance, if possible, and should be in pencil or water-proof ink to avoid illegibility due to water damage.
- **10**. The Horticulture Scale of Points is on page 14 of this schedule.

DIVISION I - HORTICULTURE

(NGC Award of Horticultural Excellence) (PLGC President's Excellence Award)

Harvest Moon

Section A – Headless Horseman- Cut flowers (NGC Award of Merit)

Five small stems, three medium stems or one large stalk. Clear containers and wedging (plastic wrap) provided by the committee.

Class 1 - Annuals

Class 2 - Perennials

Class 3 - Roses

Class 4 - Orchids

Class 5 - Chrysanthemums



Section B – **Edward Scissorhands** – Shrubs, Trees and Woody Vines *(NGC Arboreal Award)*

One stem no less than six inches and no more than thirty inches from tip to cut. Exhibitor must furnish clear glass bottle, wedging permitted (plastic wrap provided).

Class 6 - Flowering branch

Class 7 - Fruited, berried, cone bearing branch

Class 8 - Foliage branch - Broad leaf, Narrow leaf

Class 9 - Woody Vines



Section C – The Scarecrow – Produce

Plating provided by the committee.

Class 10 - Vegetables - 3 small, 1 large

Class 11 – Fruit and nuts - 3 small, 1 large

Class 12 - Herbs - 1 to 3 medium stems or one large stalk

Section D – Death Valley – Succulents

Class 13 – Container Grown Specimen (not to exceed 12")

Class 14 – Dish Gardens (miniature landscape in a low volume container)

HORTICULTURE NOTES

DIVISION II - DESIGN - RULES

- **1**. All plant material used must be listed on a 3 x 5 card. Cards will be provided by the committee.
- **2**. Any exhibit entered in competition must be the work of only one exhibitor and that exhibitor's name must appear on the entry card.
- **3**. All exhibitors are on his/her honor that designs entered in this show are original and the designs have not been entered in a prior NGC judged competition.
- **4**. Exhibitors may enter multiple classes within the Design Division but only one exhibit per class.
- **5**. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner. Plant material that has been treated to alter its exterior appearance may be used only in its dried state.
- **6**. The designer has the freedom to choose Traditional or Creative style with materials and any type design listed unless restricted by the schedule.
- **7.** If designer is unable to fulfill an assignment, it is the designer's responsibility to provide a replacement and to notify the Design Entries Chairman.
- **8**. Plant material used in designs need not have been grown by the exhibitor unless the schedule requires it.
- **9**. Landscapes or scenes are not permitted in the Design Division.
- **10**. Refer to page 81 of the NGC Flower Show Handbook for things permitted in all design classes, including panels and underlays, unless prohibited by the schedule or by law.
- **11**. The Design Scale of Points is on page 14 of this schedule.

(NGC Award of Design Excellence) (PLGC President's Excellence Award)



Things That Go Bump in the Night


Section A - Abracadabra - Petite (NGC Petite Award)

To be staged on glass shelves approximately 40" to 50" above the floor.

Class 1- *The Lilliputians* – Any NGC design not to exceed 3"x3" x3" – All dry plant material.

Class 2- *The Seven Dwarfs* – Any NGC design not to exceed 5"x5"x5" - Dry and/or fresh plant material

Class 3- *The Munchkins* – Any NGC Design not to exceed 8"x8"x8" – All fresh plant material



Section B – Autumn Magic - Dry and/or fresh **(NGC Designer's Choice Award)**To be staged on a white table top space 30" wide and 30" deep against an off white wall.



Class 4- The Sorcerer's Apprentice - Novice Designers Only (never an NGC First Place Blue Ribbon winner in the Design Division) - NGC Creative Design incorporating pumpkin(s)

Class 5-Dia de los Muertos - NGC Multi Rhythmic Design

Class 6- Moonshine - NGC Reflective Design
