

Maddy, My Rescued Monarch Butterfly

This past winter I joined the Burbank Garden Club. I had wanted to join for several years and was finally able to do so because of the time opportunity with having retired in June 2022 from 45 years of teaching in the public schools. On my first Thursday of going to the garden club, I mentioned having rescued a monarch butterfly from the spring of 2022. On that day several people showed an interest in the story. From the start of rescuing my little butterfly, I had taken videos on my phone, both for my sake, and with the thoughts of sometime later putting these videos on YouTube. At the point of going to the Garden club, I had not yet done anything with my videos. I am thankful for the people who gave me the encouragement on that day to get started on my YouTube channel. They showed enthusiasm for the topic and gave me the opportunity to talk about my little butterfly. That conversation to talk about my love for this little butterfly was all the impetus I needed to take action. On March 30 of this year, 2023, I created a YouTube channel and started uploading my videos. It gave me much pleasure to see the immediate response as I continued to add more each day. Within one month I had 12,000 views. It was fun to know that people all over the world were sharing in to watch my story about little "Maddy". Once I had a following, I no sooner uploaded a new video when several hundred people would view it right then. I had filmed 74 videos, and they have now all been uploaded, totaling 21,220 views. I have more videos to add with my most recent butterflies from this past springtime. I say that I have a monarch sanctuary on my front porch because of my milkweed plants, which the monarch butterflies and the caterpillars feast on.

I will be writing more in the next newsletter to describe my two months with my little butterfly, explaining all that I learned about these beautiful creatures. You can go on YouTube and just put my name in the search bar. My little butterfly was named, Maddy, which was a nickname for the French words, Mon petit mademoiselle Papillon, which means my Little Miss butterfly.

Milkweed, that is what they want. When the monarchs came looking for their favorite and only food in Janet's and Ingrid's gardens there was no milkweed. Where they had previously found plenty milkweed — it was gone, all gone. The milkweed plants had fizzled out. So Janet and Ingrid felt sorry for the disappointed monarchs who came looking regularly for milkweed in the customary spots. Janet and Ingrid planted replacements. We are now waiting for the milkweed to get big and tall so the monarchs will be happy again.



How To Protect Your Garden From Heavy Rain

Heavy rain can damage gardens, but there are things you can do to help protect your plants and soil before and after periods of heavy rain.

Before heavy rain:

- Refrain from transplanting young, fragile seedlings
- Wait until after the rain to sow seeds
- Hold off on applying fertilizer until after heavy rains
- Cover soil with mulch to help cut down erosion.

After heavy rain:

- Move mulch away from plants for a few days so saturated soils can dry out a little
- Wait a few days for saturated soils to dry some before transplanting seedlings
- Remove any damaged leaves, branches and other debris
- Monitor plants for new diseases (warm, moist environments are great for fungi and bacterial growth)
